

*Education Opportunities Leading to Jobs (HB 17-1041)*  
*Concurrent Enrollment Transparency Bill (HB 16-1144)*

Littleton Public Schools would like to share with you the Concurrent Enrollment and other education opportunities leading to jobs that are available to students in Littleton Public Schools.

Littleton Public Schools has various career pathways that may lead to industry certificates and jobs. Please check with your high school or [here](#) for more information.

In addition, the military offers many skills and educational opportunities. Please check with your high school counselor or [here](#) for more information if you are interested in the military.

Students in Littleton may earn Concurrent Enrollment credit in a variety of ways including:

- Available for 9<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup> grade attend a class offered for concurrent enrollment at your high school
- Participate in an off-site CTE [ACTS](#) class
- Take a class at the college –The information below pertains to this model

Concurrent Enrollment programs allow qualified 9<sup>th</sup> thru 12<sup>th</sup> grade high school students to enroll in college courses and earn both high school and college credit at no cost to them for tuition. The College Opportunity Fund and Littleton Public Schools will pay the tuition portion for college courses at the local community college rates on behalf of the student. Qualified students can enroll in college academic, career and technical education courses, which may include course work related to apprenticeship programs and internship programs. Concurrent enrollment programs help students develop the knowledge, skills and abilities necessary to be ready for college and the workforce.

The process to enroll in these types of courses is:

- Step 1: Meet with school counselor; complete ICAP (Individualized Career/Academic Plan)
- Step 2: Complete Concurrent Enrollment Agreement Form and packet/submit to counselor
- Step 3: Apply to the college
- Step 4: Take Accuplacer placement test or meet other prerequisites if applicable
- Step 4: Attend college orientation and register for classes

ACC and the Community College System offer classes which apply toward a college degree or certificate which students can take for concurrent enrollment both through the high school taught by qualified ACC high school instructors and on campus.

Many of these college courses are [guaranteed to transfer](#) to any public 4-year institution in Colorado. ACC also offers nearly 100 [degree and certificate programs](#)!

Please meet with the LPS CTE/Concurrent Enrollment Coordinator, your high school counselor or the concurrent enrollment office at ACC to make sure that any college courses that you are or will be taking meet the CE requirements. This determination may impact the course cost, your ability to transfer course credits to another college, or the amount and/or type of credits that you might receive.

Students wishing to go to another college/university must get approval from the LPS CTE/Concurrent Enrollment Coordinator.
