We are sending the Student Data Consent Form home with students on Monday, March 13, so that they may review the details of this preadministration with you and determine their consent. Please ask your student for the "Student Data Consent Form" and the "Student Data Questionnaire Supplemental Instructions for Students" so that you may review them and assist your student in completing and returning them on time.

## **Student Data Consent Form**

The Colorado Department of Education is offering all 10th grade students attending public schools in Colorado the opportunity to participate in the PSAT<sup>™</sup> 10 exam. The PSAT 10 is aligned to the Colorado Academic Standards and measures the skills and knowledge that are essential for college and career readiness. As part of the College Board's SAT<sup>®</sup> Suite of Assessments, the PSAT 10 allows you to prepare for the SAT, which you will take next year.

The College Board, the provider of the PSAT 10, gives students and families complete discretion regarding any voluntary information they provide. Either before or on test day, you will complete the Student Data Questionnaire (SDQ) on your answer sheet. The SDQ consists of some basic information about you (name, school, grade level, state student ID, sex, and date of birth) that is required to identify your test and provide a score report, along with optional questions regarding yourself and your interests. Information gathered from the optional questions will be used for a variety of purposes, including analysis to ensure that the exams are fair for all groups, group reporting, to connect you with potential colleges or scholarship opportunities, and for research.

A complete list of the information requested in the SDQ and the ways that it is used can be found on the other side of this flyer. When completing the SDQ, you will also be able to opt into Student Search Service<sup>®</sup>, which connects you with colleges and scholarship programs. If you opt in, participating colleges may provide information on financial aid and scholarships as well as information about majors, student services, and campus life. You may cancel your participation in this service at any time. To be clear, completion of the optional questions on the Student Data Questionnaire, and participation in Student Search Service are optional and voluntary for all students.
