Students parking in the church lot may only park in marked spaces.

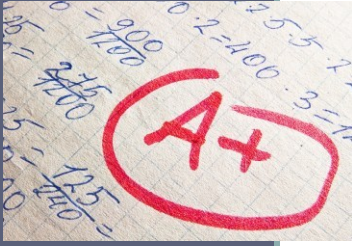

October Testing Info



Colorado has adopted a new testing company/system for CO high school students. This year's Juniors will take the SAT in April during the state-wide test date. Sophomores will take the PSAT 10 in April for their state-wide assessment. To help prepare students for this state-wide assessment and College Admissions Exam, Heritage will offer the PSAT and the PSAT 9 on Wed, Oct. 19.

- All 9th Graders will take the PSAT 9 test on Oct. 19.
- 11th graders have the opportunity to take the PSAT/NMSQT on Oct. 19

Benefits of taking the PSAT 9 and PSAT:

- Exposure to the PSAT will help prepare students for the SAT in the 11th grade.
- Customized score reports are given to students so they better understand skills that can be targeted.
- Free tutoring is available from Khan Academy based on the student's specific test performance

Additional Info:

- 10th graders will take the PSAT 10 in April

Starting Strong

9th grade seems like a long way off from 12th grade. Even so, it is important to have good habits and grades in place early. Here's why:

1. College: every semester grade you receive goes on your academic transcript, and affects your GPA. Colleges and universities receive your transcript during the application process and your GPA matters.
2. Graduation: You need 188 credits to graduate. You should receive at least 25 credits per semester to stay on track. If you get an F in a class, you will not get credit for that class (and you may need to repeat it).

If you don't earn credit for classes, it becomes less

likely that you will graduate on time.

Ways to Stay Strong:

- Check your grades on Infinite Campus weekly
- Keep a calendar of important dates/events
- Start your college search (see our Post-Grad Center)
- Know your graduation requirements
- Get Involved! Join a club, sport, or other activity. Find a balance that allows you to maintain good grades-don't stretch yourself too thin.

SMART Goals for Students

SMART Goals are a great way for students to set and meet a goal for the school year. They are:

- Specific-What is it you want to accomplish? (Who, What, Where, When, and Why)
- Measurable-How will you

know when your goal is accomplished?

- Attainable-Is it realistic?
- Relevant-Does the goal meet a need?
- Time-Bound-What is the deadline for meeting the goal?

- Example: During the first 6 weeks, I will complete my homework during the hours of 5-6:30 on school nights at my desk. After completing my homework, I will put it in my homework folder and put it in my backpack. At school the next day, I will turn it in. I will revise this goal after my first progress report.

College Application Information

There are 3 types of college application deadlines. Some schools offer 1 or 2 options, some offer all.

- Early Action-students submit their application at an earlier deadline and receive the college's decision often by the end of December. This application is non-binding. Benefits are: knowing college decisions earlier; and in some cases, **may** increase a student's chance of getting accepted to a more selective school.
- Early Decision-similar to Early Action, but this requires a written and a financial commitment to attend that school if admitted. Similar benefits as Early Action.
- Regular Decision-students submit their applications in the Spring semester of their senior year and will receive the college's decision by the end of April.



Requesting Transcripts and Letters of Rec.

The Counseling Office encourages all students to complete their college application on-line. Colleges generally prefer this method.

Transcripts

Students must request to have their transcripts sent by the Counseling Department. A \$5 processing fee is required for each transcript. Most transcripts are submitted electronically through our Naviance system.

This fee covers any mid-year, final transcripts, NCAA transcripts, and scholarships.

Letters of Recommendation

If a college requires a letter of recommendation (not all do), please plan to ask for that letter at least 2 weeks ahead of time. Questionnaires are available in the Counseling Office for

students to complete and give to their recommender. If a student is applying through the Common Application, counselors must write a letter. Make an appointment with your counselor at least 2 weeks prior to that deadline to ask for and discuss that letter. Teachers and counselors receive many requests and need the time to write each letter individually and thoughtfully.

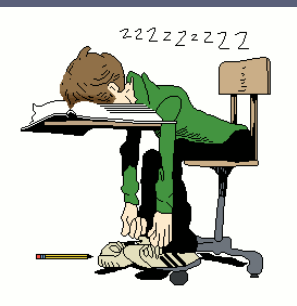


Importance of Sleep

Did you know that sleep is one of the most important activities that a high school student needs to engage in each day? Studies have shown that a lack of sleep can affect your health, mood, and cognitive abilities (i.e. learning and memory).

Tips for a Good Nights Sleep:

1. Keep a regular sleep-wake schedule throughout the week.
2. Try to get 8 1/2 to 9 1/2 hours of sleep per night.
3. Keep a regular study schedule (late night cramming can do more harm than good).
4. Eliminate high-tech distractions prior to sleep (phone, tv, computer).
5. Eliminate caffeine at least 3-5 hours before bedtime.
