Though it almost seems impossible to be true, spring is in the air! We are headed into the last three months of the school year, spring sports practices have begun, and many important state assessments are right around the corner. In this issue of the *Drum Beat*, you will find important details on the upcoming standardized tests for our students. All **freshmen** will take the **CMAS** on **April 11-13**. All **sophomores** will take the **PSAT-10** on **April 12**. All **juniors** will take the **Colorado State SAT** exam on **April 11**, and the **Colorado State Science CMAS** on **April 13**. The results of these assessments do help guide our faculty in setting goals for Arapahoe's academic school improvement and professional development each year. They are also helpful in identifying appropriate academic interventions for individual students. Thankfully, there were some changes in state assessments made last spring in the Colorado State Legislature. We are thrilled for our sophomores and juniors to have a **free opportunity** to take the PSAT-10 and SAT respectively. In their junior year, sophomores will have another opportunity to take the PSAT to try to qualify for National Merit Scholarship opportunities. Results from the SAT taken as juniors can be used for college and scholarship applications in the senior year. Many colleges and universities will take the best scores on the SAT, so the State SAT results can help individuals identify areas where they can better prepare through additional coursework to try to improve their scores. **We encourage and expect our Warriors to do their very best on these important exams.** And, as parents, you can help by ensuring students get plenty of rest, eat well, and attend school each day throughout the important testing period.

March also brings us many **exciting Arapahoe traditions** to look forward to, including our **annual Warrior Week**. We will raise money this year to support **Make-A-Wish®**. Details on Warrior Week can be found later in this edition of the *Drum Beat*.

Another exciting opportunity for our Warriors this spring is a special trip to visit our friends on the **Wind River Indian Reservation in Riverton, Wyoming**. Thanks to the Senior Class of 2017, we will be able to take approximately 50 Warriors (students and staff) to the reservation in April. The trip has traditionally been a wonderful way for us to learn about their culture and traditions, as well as to nurture our special relationship with the people for whom our school was named.

Personal opportunity for me in the spring is **reviewing all of the open-enrollment applications** for the next school year. I am happy to share that we again have numerous students requesting to attend Arapahoe. And while it is challenging to have **students on a waiting list** for 2017-2018 school year, this is tremendous news for Arapahoe High School and Littleton Public Schools. **It is a tribute to this amazing community of which you are all a part!**

It has been a wonderful spring semester, and Arapahoe teachers continue to help our students rise to and meet the rigorous academic standards expected of each Arapahoe student. We continue to offer extra time and support for students needing additional help academically. Students are always encouraged to take responsibility for their own learning by taking advantage of our variable schedule that allows our teachers to offer **one-on-one attention in every departmental office.**

# Counseling Center Guidelines

## Financial AID

Two specific financial aid sources are the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) and the CSS/Financial Aid Profile. All students applying for financial aid MUST complete the FAFSA. The FAFSA forms are only online; complete them online at [www.fafsa.ed.gov](http://www.fafsa.ed.gov). In addition, some colleges may also require the Profile, which is completed online at [profileonline.collegeboard.com](http://profileonline.collegeboard.com). Check with individual college financial aid offices to find out if the CSS Profile is required. Questions regarding FAFSA may be directed to their website, to 1-800-4FED AID(1-800-433-3243), or to individual colleges.

## College Opportunity Fund

The College Opportunity Fund (COF), created by the Colorado Legislature, provides a stipend to eligible undergraduate students. The stipend pays a portion of your total in-state tuition when you attend a Colorado public institution or a participating private institution.

Eligible undergraduate students must apply, be admitted, and enroll at a participating institution. Both new and continuing students are eligible for the stipend. Qualifying students may use the stipend for eligible undergraduate classes. The stipend is paid on a per-credit-hour basis to the institution at which the student is enrolled. The credit-hour amount will be set annually by the General Assembly.

## Important Senior Information

**College acceptances** are **contingent** upon "successful completion" of both semesters of the senior year. If grades decline or if coursework is not at the level it has been in the past, it is possible that an acceptance will be rescinded when the final transcript is reviewed by the admission personnel at the college after graduation. Please encourage your students to keep their grades up and not miss any classes.

## Junior Information

The **state mandated SAT** will be administered at Arapahoe High School **to all juniors on Tuesday, April 11**. Pre-Administration Session will take place one week prior to the test on Wednesday, April 5th in Western Civilization classes. *More details regarding the SAT test will be in the April newsletter.*

We also encourage students to sign up to take the ACT sometime during the spring of their junior year. The ACT **or** SAT is required for any student applying to a four year college/university. Juniors can schedule an appointment with their counselor for questions regarding these tests.

## Concurrent Enrollment Classes

Students enrolled at Arapahoe High School have the opportunity to take Concurrent Enrollment classes during their Junior and/or Senior year through Arapahoe Community College. Some of the classes will be offered here at Arapahoe High School, and students can enroll in those just like any other class through registration. If a student would like to take Concurrent Enrollment classes **at** Arapahoe Community College, the applications were due in the Counseling office on February 28th. These classes can be paid for by the district. Students should see their counselor with any questions.

### Advanced Placement Information

During January and February all Advanced Placement students received information in their AP classes about Advanced Placement examinations, which will be given May 1-5 and May 8-12. Please refer to the [Bulletin for AP Students and Parents](#). Students who are taking the AP exams should have ordered their exams by February 22. The cost of one exam is \$95. An AHS Billing Statement from the Bookkeeping Office reflecting the cost of the ordered exam(s) will be mailed in March. Examinees are **required** to attend **one** mandatory pre-registration session either Tuesday, April 4 or Wednesday, April 5. Please refer to the handout students received in their AP classes. Students should contact Mrs. Gillespie or Mr. Lewis in the Counseling Center if they have questions.

### Career & Technical Education

Sophomores and Juniors who are interested in attending the Area Career and Technical School (ACTS) for next school year may sign up online at [www.lps2.it/ACTS](http://www.lps2.it/ACTS). Students may choose from many career fields and some programs earn college credits at ACC. **The deadline for sending the application was February 28th.** Students should see their counselor if they have questions.

**COLLEGE NIGHT:** College Night, held on Monday, February 6th, drew a full house! Our crowd far exceeded the number of RSVPs received; we will brainstorm ways to address the issue of space, if interest in this program continues. Jill Athenour, Head to College Admissions Consultant, returned as our keynote speaker. **APPLICATION DAY:** The Post Grad Center is hosting an **Application Day on Friday, March 17th from 8:00-10:00** am for seniors who would still like to apply to college. College representatives from four year colleges, two year colleges, and career and vocational schools will be on hand to provide information about their schools and to help students complete applications. All participating colleges will waive their application fee! AHS will provide supporting documents so that in two hours time, students can apply to multiple schools. **SENIORS:** There are several scholarship opportunities listed in the scholarship section in Naviance. Please take time to peruse the list and submit applications! If awarded a scholarship, please bring the **scholarship award letter** to the Post Grad Center by May 1st. Students accepting scholarships will be honored at the Senior Convocation Award Night on Monday, May 22nd. Remember to officially **accept/decline college admissions offers and scholarships** by May 1st.

**JUNIORS:** Junior students are scheduled for their junior Post Grad appointment this semester. This appointment is completely different from the sophomore visit. Students learn how to use Naviance Family Connection to build their college list, research application requirements, become familiar with the Common Application, and complete required elements in the college application process. It can be complex, but during this appointment, we break it down into manageable steps for students to begin now. Waiting until senior year leaves too much to manage in one semester. **Remember, this is the semester to build the college list.** Take advantage of the upcoming **College Visits @ AHS** to learn more about these colleges. This month, the Post Grad Center will host the University of Wyoming, the University of Missouri, Texas Tech University, Baylor University, the University of Arizona, the University of Utah, West Point, the University of Nebraska, and the United States Air Force Academy. Log in to Naviance for details and to sign up. Remember to ask your teacher for permission to miss 30 minutes of class time and have them sign the College Rep Visit blue pass, available in the Post Grad Center, in ADVANCE of the visit day. Be sure to attend the **Spring 2017 College Fair** at the University of Denver Ritchie Center on Sunday, March 19th from 1:00-3:30 pm. Click [here](#) to see the list of participating schools and for the option to pre-register. Finally, complete the **Class of 2018 Biography** in Naviance during the month of March. AHS teachers and counselors use this required document when writing letters of recommendation for students. Do this now to avoid having too many tasks to complete in the fall.

## AHS ASSESSMENT NEWS

Quality assessments are an important component of a student's total learning experience. Assessment data informs instruction, helps teachers determine intervention strategies, and contributes to program evaluation. This data also provides comparability and accountability. AHS is committed to the success of every student. To that end, multiple measures are used to ensure individual student growth and achievement. I have provided **some background** on the standardized assessments in Colorado. As you will see, Colorado requirements currently exceed the federal requirements.

**Federal laws and requirements** regarding assessments tie into **federal accountability and Title I funding.**

- **English/Language Arts & Math:** All students in grades 3-8 must be tested annually; once in high school, ninth grade or higher
- **Science:** All students must be tested one time at each level: elementary, middle, high
- **95% Participation Rate:** Required on all testing

**Colorado state laws and requirements** tie into **accreditation.**

- **English/Language Arts & Math:** All students grades **3-11 tested annually**, plus **Colorado SAT** for juniors.
- **Science & Social Studies:** All students must be tested one time at each level: elementary, middle, and high. **This year, Arapahoe juniors will take the statewide Science CMAS.**
- **PSAT 10:** All sophomores are registered to take to PSAT-10.
- **Colorado law requires that all students enrolled in a public school must take the statewide assessments (Section 22-7-409)(d)(10(A), C.R.S.). Please consult the Littleton Public Schools website for more information.**

## Important Attendance Reminders

- When calling your student in, please leave the following information (speaking slowly):
- Your student's name—last name, then first name—**please clearly spell the last name**
- Your student's grade
- The date of the absence
- The class period(s) that your student will miss
- **Please Do Not Forget The Reason for the absence**
- If you have already called in your student's absence to the message line, there is no need to call it in again to the receptionist. All calls are received and processed to Infinite Campus as soon as possible. If you have called in an absence for your student and still receive a "robo" call in the evening, please consider your student may have missed a different period than what you have called in, or, perhaps it is for a sibling



## PLEASE NOTE:

**Due to the high volume of phone calls, please only call one time and leave one message per absence.**

All excused absences must be called in to the Attendance Office by a parent or guardian **within 24 hours**. We do not accept written notes or emails.

Students must pick up a pass from the Attendance Office in order to leave school when missing classes for an appointment during the school day. A parent must call the Attendance Office early that morning or the day before to arrange for the pass. **The student is responsible for picking up the pass before the scheduled departure time.** Please have your student sign in at the Attendance Office upon returning from an appointment.

**ONLY parents** are allowed to call in student attendance. If a student has reached the age of eighteen, the parent must still call in, as calls are not accepted from students.

If your student becomes ill while at school, they must go to the Health Clinic which is located in Student Services, there they can wait to be picked up/released. Students are not allowed on campus if they have been called in sick.

To check student attendance, access the Infinite Campus Parent Portal.

Please take a moment to read through some important information from our After Prom team.


### ATTENTION SENIOR PARENTS

It is a tradition at AHS to have a "senior picture gallery" at After Prom. We are asking you to create a collage for your child that will hang in the hallway the night of the event. **The theme this year is: A SECRET - we're keeping it a surprise until May.** All collages will be created in the shape of a suit case, **an example is attached.** Please follow the directions below. We look forward to seeing your wonderful creations.

### MAKING YOUR COLLAGE

1. Gather all your photos—use color copies if you don't want to use originals. Some ideas for the collages can be: a "friends" collage, a senior year collage, a high school years collage, a sports collage, a family memories collage, milestones in your kids life—whatever you choose, have fun with it!
2. To start, purchase a piece of standard 22"x28" poster board either in white or black. Please do not purchase the heavyweight board as it will be too heavy to hang. The background that the collages will be hung on is gold.
3. Cut the poster board into a shape of a suit case—see attached drawing for dimensions.
4. Put your student's name, AHS, and 2017 on the front of the suit case. A 3 x 5 (or 4 x 6) index card in the shape of a luggage tag would work well to show case this info.
5. Glue your student's pictures to the front; please do not use tape as it will not keep the pictures on the poster board. (Laminating will keep all pictures in place—see below.)
6. Neatly, on the back of the suit case, list the student's name, parent's first and last name, and a contact phone number.
7. **Once completed, consider having your collage laminated. This service is available at Staples in the Streets of South Glen. We highly recommend this for the best presentation and longevity of your student's collage. The cost is about \$4.00.**
8. Deliver your collage to the school's main office between April 26<sup>th</sup> and May 5<sup>th</sup> before 3:00 p.m. each day and place the collage in the large collection box.
9. The collages will be available for pick up in the main office from May 8<sup>th</sup> to the 12<sup>th</sup> by either a parent or student.

### **Centennial Ordinance No. 2006-O-18 / Arapahoe County Ordinance 2008-1** **PROHIBITING THE POSSESSION OF TOBACCO PRODUCTS BY MINORS**

**Minor:** A person under 18 years of age.

**Possess:** Has or holds any amount of a tobacco product anywhere on his/her person, has tobacco products within his/her immediate presence and control, including within a motor vehicle. Also includes the consumption, smoking, ingesting, absorbing, inhaling, or chewing of any tobacco product.

**VIOLATIONS:**

Upon conviction shall be fined \$75.00 for first offense. For the second and subsequent offenses, the court shall impose a fine between \$100.00 and \$300.00. A mandatory court appearance is required with each violation.

The City of Centennial ordinance went into effect in October 2006, and for schools in unincorporated Arapahoe County, tobacco became illegal for minors in early 2008.

I feel like I talk about this subject all the time. I don't know what to do to keep students from smoking. I try to explain the dangers. I give warnings to students, and the very next day I find the same students smoking in the same spot. The only solution I can think of is to write tickets on and off school grounds. **The City of Centennial also considers "E-Cigarettes" containing nicotine as a violation under this statute.**

**A FEW FACTS:**

- 3 million kids under 18 are current smokers.
- More than 6.3 million kids who are currently under 18 will eventually die from smoking-related disease.
- Almost 90% of adult smokers began at or before age 19.
- More than a third of all kids who try smoking become regular, daily smokers before leaving high school.
- Cigarettes and chewing tobacco are associated with numerous health problems.


