Optional Technology Fee

Technology is an ever more important tool for students and teachers at Arapahoe. Our students will spend the rest of their lives in a multi-tasking, technology-driven world and will need information and communication technology literacy in order to be successful – in both their professional and personal lives. Technology is not the goal, but rather it is the enabler that allows us to achieve our goals. We are exploring ways to use technology to enable a more student-centered approach to instruction; to create a culture of learning where students take a greater role in producing and managing their own learning. We are attempting to provide teachers and students with 21st century learning skills, and an environment where students and teachers have access to the resources they need when they need them.

Even with some students bringing their own devices, we still have a need for additional funding to support all students and to support the infrastructure for students who bring their own. Therefore, we have listed an optional \$30 technology fee as part of the fees students pay at registration. We want to be very clear – this fee is completely optional and \$30 is just a suggested amount. You can choose to pay nothing, less than \$30, \$30 itself, or even \$50 or \$100 if you'd like (we won't say no):-). This money will be used solely to support student technology needs. This will include items like computers and LCD Projectors (and replacement bulbs), and less exciting – but still necessary – items such as toner cartridges, cabling and software licensing.

Should you choose to contribute, we would also suggest you consider contacting the Human Resources Department at your employer, as many employers offer matching funds for school donations. Advanced Placement (AP) Examinations

Please view AP testing information on this <u>website</u> for scheduled days and times of exams and locations. Students who have an AP exam are excused from school only during the exam time.

All AP exams are administered at the Ames Facility at 7300 S Clermont Drive Centennial (map) and Arapahoe High School. Student arrival time TBA at Pre-Registration.

Each AP exam costs \$95.00. A billing statement from the AHS Bookkeeping Office reflecting the cost of the ordered exam(s) was mailed in March. Payment is due upon receipt of the billing statement and needs to be paid prior to the exam. Checks should be made out to Arapahoe High School. Other Financial Aid Scams to Avoid

Fake websites—FAFSA.com or FAFSA.org are NOT official websites for completing the Free Application for Federal Student Aid. These sites and other financial aid websites tempt students to complete the online FAFSA through their site and charge the applicant money after they have entered personal financial information.

The <u>only</u> official website is <u>www.fafsa.ed.gov</u> and <u>it is FREE</u>. Loans with up-front fees—Although there are fees associated with legitimate government and private loans, the fee is almost always deducted from the disbursed amount. The borrower should not pay fees up front without first verifying carefully that the lender is legitimate.

Senior Information

During TRIBE on April 4th, seniors received information about completing the Arapahoe Graduation survey. Seniors logged on to their Naviance accounts to complete the survey, which collects information for the Awards Convocation on May 21st and Graduation on May 24th. Information seniors provided included: confirmation of future plans after high school, scholarship monies awarded, and final transcript requests.

Scheduling and Registration

Arapahoe High School values student input and encourages participation in the decision-making that goes into building a student's schedule. Our scheduling process enables students to make some decisions about their schedules; however, it does not guarantee that students will have the period or the teacher they request, regardless of when they registered.

Please understand that after scheduling we may need to change some student schedules in order to balance classes. Additionally, based on enrollment of classes after scheduling, some sections of classes may have to be added and/or canceled. This too, may impact an individual student's schedule.

Seniors:

Thank you for stopping by with updates on your future plans, college choices, and scholarship award letters! It is wonderful to share in your excitement!

Seniors, please carefully go through this checklist of remaining tasks:

- © Complete the **Senior Exit Survey** in Naviance, which can be accessed through this <u>link</u>. The survey is in the left hand column under the "About Me" tab. Most students completed the survey in April's TRIBE, but there are over 100 students who have yet to finish it. Please log in before noon on Wednesday, May 2, 2018 to "make the map" in the May edition of the Herald Magazine. (At the latest, students must complete this survey in order to pick up their graduation cap and gown on Senior Fun in the Sun Day.)
- ♦ Please turn in **Scholarship Award Letters no later than Friday, May 4th**. Only **verified** scholarship awards will be recognized at the Awards Convocation Ceremony. Please submit the scholarship award letters to the Post Grad Center no later than Friday, May 4th.
- AHS final transcripts must be requested through Naviance within the Senior Exit Survey. Colleges require receipt of this transcript prior to registering for your classes!! If you paid Mrs. Arnold for an initial transcript and submitted the blue form to her when you initially applied, your final transcript fee is already covered. If you did not complete this process initially because your college did not require it, then you must do it now to cover your final transcript fee. Final transcripts will be sent through Naviance the first week in June. Please print a copy for your records. You may need it for a variety of reasons such as a discount on auto insurance OR sorority/fraternity rush.
- ♦ Concurrent Enrollment transcripts must be requested directly from Arapahoe Community College by clicking on this <u>link</u>. This is **NOT** sent by Arapahoe High School to your college. While high school credit is reflected on your high school transcript, in order to receive the college credit for that class, students must request a college transcript directly from Arapahoe Community College Prior to requesting your transcript, be sure to first view your unofficial ACC transcript to ensure your grade has been posted. Please direct all questions to ACC Admissions and Records at 303.797.5621 or <u>admissions@arapahoe.edu</u>.
- Advanced Placement Credit must be requested directly from the College Board. This is NOT sent by Arapahoe High School to your college. Scores from AP exams taken this spring are expected to be available in mid-July. Please sign in to your College Board account to request these scores by clicking here. Please read this FAQs if you have questions by clicking here. For further assistance, please contact the College Board directly at 888-225-5427 or apstudents@info.collegeboard.org.
- Awards Convocation: Students who will graduate with high honors (3.8 or above through 8 semesters), students who will graduate with honors (3.5 or above through 8 semesters), and/or students who will accept a scholarship (that has been verified with an Award Letter turned into Mrs. Hall by Friday, May 4th), will be invited by Amanda Clark, Mrs. Pramenko's assistant, to the Awards Convocation Ceremony on Monday, May 21st at 6:00pm. This is a wonderful and well-attended ceremony that you will not want to miss.
- Students staying in-state for college, be sure to sign up for the **College Opportunity Fund (COF)** by clicking here. The College Opportunity Fund provides a stipend to Colorado high school students who stay in the state of Colorado for college. This stipend is paid directly to the college to offset tuition. This stipend is often already reflected in the in-state tuition figure on the college website, so students who do not sign up risk paying between \$9,000-\$11,000 more than the stated tuition on the college website over the next 4 years. Be sure to set aside 10 minutes to sign up! While it is guaranteed money for those going to public colleges in Colorado, there is a financial eligibility component for those going to private Colorado colleges. For more information, click here.
- ♦ **FAFSA**...you may still have time to file as the federal deadline is not until midnight (central time) on June 30, 2018. There are also state deadlines and your college may also have a deadline. Click <u>here</u> to determine if you still have time to file. Should you need assistance, click <u>here</u> to sign up for a 30 minute time slot at the FAFSA lab at ACC. The FAFSA lab is a free service offered to the local community every Monday between now and June 25th.
- ♦ **College communication through email and student portals:** Please watch for these communications by regularly checking for information on next steps including housing, orientation, class registration, immunization records, etc.
- Senior students and parents will also receive this checklist through the Infinite Campus messenger system. Be sure that your contact information is up-to-date!

Journalism Students Win National Awards

At the national high school journalism convention in San Francisco in April, several students did well in contests focused on writing and photography: **Joey Mason**, Superior, Yearbook Sports Writing; **Declan Palmer**, Excellent, Sports Action Photography; **Hayden Peirce**, Excellent, Editorial Writing; **Austin Schlaver**, Excellent, Sports Feature Photography; **Macala Wallace**, Excellent, Photo Story; **Lauren David**, Honorable Mention, Portrait Photo; **Maggie Foa**, Honorable Mention, Newswriting; and **Kaitlyn Tejero**, Honorable Mention, Yearbook Student Life Writing.

The student journalists of AHS also won several top awards this year. The Herald news magazine and the ArapahoeXtra.com student website, as well as The Calumet yearbook were honored with Silver Crown Awards by the Columbia Scholastic Press Association in March. This is the 4th consecutive year the yearbook has won a Crown Award. The Crown Awards are one of the two highest national honors for scholastic journalism. The other top national award is the Pacemaker from the National Scholastic Press Association. Both The Herald and The Calumet were named Pacemaker Finalists this year.



Important Attendance Reminders

- When calling your student in, please leave the following information (speaking slowly):
 - Your student's name—last name, then first name please clearly spell the last name
 - Your student's grade
 - The date of the absence
 - The class period(s) that your student will miss
 - Please Do Not Forget The reason for the absence (eg. Out of Town, Sick, Appointment)
- Calls received by 1:30pm are processed to Infinite Campus the same day. Calls received after 1:30pm will result in an Automated Message that night and will be processed the next school day to Infinite Campus. If you have called in an absence for your student before 1:30pm and still receive the automated massage call in the evening, please consider your student may have missed a different period than what you have called in, or, perhaps it is for a sibling. You can verify your student's absence in the Infinite Campus.
- It is very important to understand that student attendance at school on the day of your A.P. exam(s) is required.
- A.P. students are expected to continue attending all regularly scheduled classes, including the A.P. class, until the last day of class for your grade level.
- A student missing one class to make up work or assignments for another, is not considered an excused absence.

PLEASE NOTE:



All excused absences must be called in to the Attendance Office by a parent or guardian within 24 hours. We do not accept written notes or emails.

Students must pick up a pass from the Attendance Office in order to leave school during the school day. A parent must leave a message on the attendance line to arrange for the pass. The student is responsible for picking up the pass before the scheduled departure time. Please have your student sign in at the Attendance Office upon returning from an appointment.

ONLY parents/guardians are allowed to call in student attendance. If a student has reached the age of eighteen, the parent must still call in, as calls are not accepted from students.

If your student becomes ill while at school, they should go to the Health Clinic which is located in Student Services, where they can wait to be picked up/released. Students are not allowed on campus if they have been called in sick.

Teen Drivers, I'm Talking to YOU!

I write a great deal about teen driving in my articles and talk about it frequently during the school day. I feel this is a topic that requires continual discussion and education. When a teen finally gets a driver's license, it is an exciting time. Along with that excitement, comes responsibility. The laws were put into place because of previous teen fatalities while driving. I took some of the laws that are posted on www.coteendriver.com to make you aware of them or to refresh your memory. These are just a few of the laws. Please read them and follow them.

Teen Driving Restrictions

The rules of the road apply to drivers of all ages, but there are certain additional restrictions that all teen drivers need to know.

Passenger restrictions: Teens with a permit:

No passengers other than a driving instructor, parent/legal guardian or a licensed adult 21 years of age or older. Teens with a license:

- For the first six months, no passengers under 21, unless a parent or other licensed adult driver is in the vehicle.
- For the next six months, one passenger under age 21 (unsupervised).
- Siblings and passengers with medical emergencies are exceptions.
- At any time, no more than one passenger is allowed in the front seat.


Mandatory seat belts: By law, ALL teen drivers and passengers must wear seat belts (no sharing a seatbelt ever!)

Cell phones and texting banned: Teens under age 18 are prohibited from using a cell phone while driving. Teens can be fined and may risk losing their license. Exceptions include emergency calls to the police or fire department.

Curfew: For the first year as a licensed driver, your teen must abide by a curfew—no driving between midnight and 5 a.m. unless accompanied by an instructor, parent or legal guardian. Exceptions include: driving to/from school/work (signed statement from school/work required), medical emergencies and emancipated minors. Curfew laws may vary by city or county. To properly follow the curfew in your area, please confirm restrictions with your local government.

Zero tolerance for drunk driving

Eight young people die every day in the U.S. in alcohol-related crashes. Talk with your teen about the dangers of driving drunk or riding with someone who has used alcohol or drugs. Driving under the influence of alcohol—even a trace of alcohol on minor drivers—is punishable by law.
