October also brought a noticeable change in the weather. We recently wrapped up a very successful **2018 Homecoming week** with our fun theme of "**Dancing Through the Decades**." All of our events are designed to provide positive memories for our Warriors and enhance their comprehensive high school experience. The talent show, DECA BBQ, bonfire, parade, dance and many athletic events we hold would not be possible without the enthusiasm of the entire Arapahoe community. A huge shout-out to all members of our **Arapahoe Student Council**, under new leadership of sponsors **Katie Abner and Jackie Price**, for the organization of this wonderful tradition-filled week. Significant and welcome changes were made to the dance this year, and the attendance more than doubled. There were multiple activities added to enhance the evening. **Thank you all so much for your continued support of our Homecoming events**!

After the excitement of Homecoming comes to an end, the reality of the classroom sets in. Our main goal at Arapahoe is to prepare all of our students for meaningful post-secondary opportunities. Throughout the month of September, Arapahoe counselors visited with each grade level in small meetings in the AHS Forum. **Freshmen** received a message about starting strong and how poor grades their freshman year can negatively affect their transcript. They also learned how some of their current classes can help them meet the new **LPS Graduation Competencies (click here for more information)**. **Sophomores** were taught how to access Naviance early and encouraged to get in and navigate the website before their junior year. **Juniors** are preparing to take the **PSAT on Wednesday**, **October 10**, **2018**. They are also encouraged to use Naviance to begin the college search process. **Seniors** are busy signing up for the national SAT and ACT as well as madly preparing their college applications. Arapahoe will be presenting **Financial Aid Night** on Monday, October 8, 2018 at 6:00 PM in the theater. Dates and further information on all of the 2018-2019 national testing can be found in the Counseling Center section of this issue of the *Drum Beat*. As always, please contact your student's counselor or our Post Grad Center if you have any questions.

Though the Colorado Commission on Higher Education sets minimum course requirements (see below) for acceptance to colleges and universities throughout Colorado, it is clear from the data that **Arapahoe students far exceed these minimum requirements**. We highly encourage seniors to keep a rigorous and challenging course load all the way through their final year of high school.

These requirements set by CCHE are backed by research that shows that fewer than forty percent of college students complete their collegiate education. CCHE research further claims that, "Regardless of economic status, race, gender or high school program, the proportion of students receiving their bachelor's degree tends to increase with the completion of a rigorous pattern of high school courses taken." We also know that four strong years of preparation in the core academic areas also leads to a stronger performance on the ACT, SAT, and other college entrance exams.

While we prepare every Warrior to graduate with a college-prep experience, we offer many attractive and meaningful elective courses and value our **comprehensive high school curriculum**. Course preparation in the arts, business, technology, physical education, and core-area electives produce a well-rounded individual. We value high academic preparation, and it is important to remember that alongside these high expectations there is a tremendous amount of support offered by all of the dedicated Arapahoe faculty and staff. Many departments have **targeted intervention programs** in place for students that are not meeting minimum requirements for classes. The **Academic Study Center** is available as a pass/fail class or as a place to drop in during the school day for assistance from teachers every period of every day. Teachers are also available during unscheduled hours in their **departmental offices**. Success and self-confidence are enhanced when a positive attitude and a solid work ethic are embedded in student efforts. When these values are supported in both the home and school environments, our Warriors have the best possible chance to achieve and succeed at a higher level!

Colorado Safe Schools Month 2018 is here! As part of an ongoing effort to promote a safe and healthy culture in all Littleton Public Schools, Arapahoe High School will participate in the **Comprehensive School Climate Inventory (CSCI)** throughout the month of October. The CSCI is a brief 15-20 minute, anonymous survey of students (grades 3-12), parents, and school-based staff to gather perceptions about the school environment. The survey includes questions about **safety, relationships, engagement, support for learning, etc.** The feedback we gather about our school climate will help guide efforts to provide supportive learning environments for all students. The survey is administered electronically, and **all results** are completely **anonymous** (no names are recorded, and no identifying information is attached to specific responses). You can access the survey via **this link.** Additionally, we will reach out to all Arapahoe parents and guardians with an email containing the link to **the survey**. The survey window for parents will begin on **October 1st** and will remain open until **October 31st**. Students will complete this survey later this month during TRIBE. Important Attendance Office Statistics and Information

Arapahoe is proud to announce that our 2017/2018 Attendance statistics report that shows students missed an average of only 4.3 days last year--this is a dramatic decrease of 6.5% from the previous year! We are confident that when parents understand the link between high achievement and attendance, students are more likely to be in class and ready to learn at a high level. Our attendance intervention methods along with our strong teaching faculty and extracurricular programs help keep kids engaged in school-culture both mentally and physically.

The district's guidelines related to attendance are the following: after 8 days (or it's equivalency) of absences due to illness, students will be asked to bring in a doctor's note to have the absence or any additional absence marked as excused. If your student misses 10 days of school (or it's equivalency), we will review individually how we can help support the student, which may include developing an attendance plan. The district will send out an attendance letter each quarter to families of students who have missed 20% or more of school, indicating that the student has reached a highly-concerning number of missed days, and district specialists will be utilized to increase attendance. If there are challenges with consistent attendance, LPS has many resources to support families. Please let us know if you have any questions.

Important Attendance Procedures for Students and Parents

- Students must pick up a pass from the Attendance Office in order to leave school during a scheduled class. PASSES ARE NOT DELIVERED! Passes are not required when leaving during a passing period, see <u>Bell</u> <u>Schedule</u> if questions about passing period times.
- All excused absences must be called in to the Attendance Office by a parent or guardian within 24 hours. We do not accept written notes. When calling the attendance line, please follow the recorded instructions, speaking clearly. Failure to leave ALL of the required information will result in an unexcused absence.
- Please be aware that if you receive an "Automated Message" call and have already called in, consider that the call may have been received after 2:30 p.m. and will be recorded the next morning, the period your student missed may be different than the period recorded, or perhaps a sibling missed a period. You can check your Infinite Campus Portal for this information.
- We recommend that you check your student's attendance at least once a week by accessing the <u>Infinite Campus Parent Portal</u>.

PSAT - Wednesday, October 10, 2018

The Preliminary Scholastic Aptitude Test (PSAT) is designed to give **juniors** experience with tests similar to those required for college admission. The format has four sections: one reading, two math, and one writing. Additionally, the PSAT is used by the National Merit Scholarship Corporation to determine National Merit Scholarship Semi-Finalists. Other scholarship agencies also use the PSAT, and nearly all colleges/ universities seek National Merit Semi-Finalists.

Students can **register** for the PSAT in the Counseling Office by October 3rd, the cost is \$20.00 and is non-refundable. Payment and photo ID are required to register. October 10th is the only date that the PSAT will be administered in the Littleton Public School district for the 2018-2019 school year. **Students will receive the Official Student Guide** to the PSAT/NMSQT when they register. Calculators may be used on the mathematics sections. The test takes approximately 3 hours 30 minutes. Results will be given to students in late December.

Students who are taking the PSAT need to **arrive at** school by 9:00 a.m. and report to their classrooms no later than 9:10 a.m. The test will begin promptly at 9:30 a.m.

IMPORTANT—The buses will ONLY run on the normal schedule for all students. There will not be a second bus run for students not taking the PSAT for our late start of classes. Please plan accordingly.

Last year nearly 600 Arapahoe Juniors and Sophomores signed up to take this nationally recognized examination. It is preparation for College Board examinations, can produce scholarship money, and is the only exam that qualifies students to attain National Merit Scholar status, when taken during the junior year. We are encouraging <u>every</u> AHS junior to take the PSAT.

In order to provide the maximum opportunity to our Juniors, we are offering the PSAT during our school day at AHS. Please call 303-347-6010 if you have any questions.

Connecting the PSAT 9 and PSAT 10 to the SAT

In order to better prepare Colorado juniors for the SAT, College Board has formed a partnership with Khan Academy.

With the changes in state assessments, AHS sophomores and freshman will be taking the PSAT 10 and PSAT 9, respectively the second week of April and juniors will be taking the SAT on April 9, 2019.

Then utilizing their PSAT 10 and PSAT 9 scores, students have the opportunity to sign up for Khan Academy's review program.

In comparison to other test preparation programs, Khan Academy aims to provide free, optional, secure and personalized review to all Colorado students on their smartphones. Within the program, students can sign up to receive questions of the day and take practice tests; all designed from their personal PSAT 10 and PSAT 9results. Please note that this review program does not replace classroom instruction, but can provide them with additional, free practice outside of class.

The Herald Student News Magazine Nominated for Top National Award

The Herald student news magazine from 2017-2018 was one of 67 outstanding student publications named as a Pacemaker finalist by the National Scholastic Press Association.

"The Pacemaker is the association's preeminent award," said Laura Widmer, executive director. "NSPA is honored to recognize the best of the best."

The NSPA Pacemaker award has a rich tradition and the association started presenting the award to high school newspapers a few years after the organization was founded in 1921. Throughout the years, yearbooks, magazines, online sites and broadcast programs were added to the competition.

The 67 Pacemaker finalists represent 24 states and England. Arapahoe was the only school from Colorado named as a finalist.

In all, 260 student news publications entered the Pacemaker competition. Two teams of three judges devoted two days to the judging and studied every entry discussing its strengths and weaknesses. When the process was finished, the 67 Pacemaker finalists were named. From that group, 28 will earn the Pacemaker award placing those publications in the top 10 percent.

In addition to demonstrating excellence in key areas including coverage, writing, editing, design and photography, the winning newspapers took risks and served as a strong voice for its student audience.

Pacemaker finalists will be recognized and the Pacemaker winners will be announced at the JEA/ NSPA Fall National High School Journalism Convention, Nov. 1-4, 2018 in Chicago. EReaders, ebooks and Digital Audio Books are available from the Arapahoe High School Library to all AHS students!

Digital technology has expanded in the Arapahoe High School Library with the use of eReaders. These devices are free of charge and can be checked out for 21 days.

E-books may be accessed through a browser by going to the **Destiny Discover link** found on the **AHS Library webpage**. Students login using their school email username (XXX@lpsk12.org) and their email password. Available titles include popular and new fiction, along with fiction and nonfiction titles specifically selected to support curricular needs on a wide range of topics such as economics, forensic science, government, health, and personal finance, just to name a few.

In addition to using a browser, students may use the **Destiny Discover App for eBooks**. The app is Android, Apple iOS, Kindle, Mac OS X, Nook, and Windows compatible. It uses the same login as the Universal Search page. The app permits users to not only read e-books but to also listen to digital audio books. EBooks and audio books may also be accessed free of charge through your local public library app, along with the use of the **Overdrive app**.

Parents, I need your help... a big problem we keep hearing about is underage drinking. I know this isn't every parent, but I have heard of several situations where parents gave alcohol to their child and child's friends. Recently I investigated the details and wanted to share the laws with everyone so you aware.

or 303-347-4092

Parents, it is illegal to give alcohol to your child's friend who is under 21, even in your own home, and if you have the child's parent's permission. You may not sell, serve, give away, dispose of, exchange, deliver, permit the sale, serve, give, or procure alcohol to anyone under the age of 21. If you are charged with these acts, the maximum penalty is up to 1 year in jail, probation, and a fine. You can also be civilly liable for a teen who is caught after leaving your home where alcohol is served.

You cannot induce, aid, or encourage a child to break any law. This can be deemed as "Contributing to the Delinquency of a Minor", a Class 4 <u>FELONY</u>. If convicted of a class 4 <u>FELONY</u>, you could face prison time of 2-8 years, up to 3 years of parole, fines of \$2,000-\$50,000 and the loss of your driver's license.

What you can do as a parent: If your child has a party, refuse to supply alcohol, be home, be involved in the party, limit the number of guests and don't allow guests to come and go. If your teenager is attending a party, know where the party is and how long he or she will be there. Contact the parents of the party giver.

Teens: It is illegal for minors to have, hold, own, or have custody of any alcohol within their immediate presence or control. Even if you are not drinking, but you are at a party where others are drinking, you can receive a minor in possession charge. **The only exception to the rule is** The Safe Haven Rule: Minors who call 911 and report that another minor is in need of medical assistance due to alcohol consumption, provide their names to the 911 operator, and stay on scene until assistance arrives. **For more information go to www.assetsconnect.org.**




