Superintendent

- Background
  - o Dr. Lambert shared a little of his background. You can learn more on his webpage.
    - Started career in elementary, went to high school and then district leadership
    - Two kids in their 20s
    - Wife is a teacher
  - 3.5 months in just trying to meet everyone and learn about the community
    - Trying to learn as much as he can about LPS
  - Challenges in district
    - Transportation understands how important it is and director of transportation is extremely dedicated to workable solutions
      - Going to continue to hire and doing the best they can
      - Trying to entice people to apply we have more routes than available people to drive the routes
      - Trying to be most efficient with their routes (consolidate and shorten distances and stops)
      - Taking this into consideration with long-range planning and boundaries
      - Delayed bus routes
        - LPS Administration office staff is rotating to schools to help supervise students that have to stay at school longer waiting for the bus
    - Little Raven closing in on finishing construction
      - Weather and Denver Water were the biggest impacts
    - Long-Range Planning
      - Will look at bus routes when discussing boundary changes
      - They look at a lot of different factors when making recommendations

- Put together in 2017
- Most of the committee is still there from 2017
  - They were all chosen based on representing different stakeholder groups (various district committees; senior volunteers; charter schools; construction industry; etc.)

- Been on Board for 8 years and about to term out
- Use PPC to help bring information back to schools and find people to join the Board
- 2 people up for election this year
  - One person running for re-election (Lindley McCrary)
  - 4 people running for the Board seats
    - We will get information about candidate forums
      - Wed., Oct. 4 at 6:30 p.m. in boardroom and will be a live stream
      - Oct. 18-District Accountability Committee 7 p.m.
- PTOs having candidate forums are encouraged to invite all candidates to the event
- Long-Range Planning Committee—Overcrowding at Ford Elementary and under-enrollment at Powell
  are two key concerns
  - Postponed decision last year in order to have the best data possible
  - Changes could be put in place for next fall
  - o Baby bust in 2009 many CO districts have decreasing enrollment
    - We don't have good data on family makeup for people moving into the district
    - We get 20% of our kids from out-of-district
- First new superintendent in 8 years
  - o Board feels that Todd has done a great job in the transition
