- School year shift
  - Boundaries and Board election shifted focus at the beginning of the year
  - Legislative session
    - CO Association of School Boards (CASB) convention
      - 4 of 12 kids in leadership were from LPS including the kid that heads the group
      - Lindley was elected CASB President
      - Biggest issues deal with the funding formula
        - Districts are meeting and really picks up in March to make sure we are funded correctly
        - Most CO districts are rural and therefore makes the funding formula tricky
  - PLCs
    - Teachers come together in a formative process
    - Helps kids in a positive way all kids benefit
    - A lot of principals/staff have come into the district since the first PLC training and now LPS is working with the principals to make sure they all have the training
  - Transportation

    - Try to offer classes that are different from the ways the home high schools are teaching similar subjects

  - 800+ students for second semester
  - Mostly juniors and seniors at EPIC
  - Transportation between the schools has been great
  - Working through a few challenges with the scheduling between the high schools and EPIC (EPIC classes are a double period)
