Other IB Diploma Program Requirements

Theory of Knowledge course (ToK)

TOK meets in a scheduled period in the second semester junior year and first semester senior year. It is a .5 credit class each semester.

Extended Essay (EE)

* 4,000-word research essay on a topic of student's choice * Students begin the process in spring of junior year and complete the essay in fall of senior year. * Each student works with a teacher-adviser.

Creativity, Activity and Service (CAS)

* 150 hours total. This includes a student-designed 50-hour service project. * The remaining hours are divided among a variety of <u>creativity</u>, <u>activity</u> and <u>service</u> experiences. * Students undertake activities at the start of junior year and complete all experiences, reflections, and supervisor reviews before March 1 of senior year.
