



DEFINITIONS

ASCENT Program

Allows high school seniors to have their first year of college paid for if they have earned 9 college credits by graduation.

TREP Program

Allows high school seniors that want to become educators to have their first 2 years of college paid for.

Concurrent Enrollment

When high school students take college courses while in high school, earning high school and college credit at the same time for the same class.

LPS Summer CE

Allows 9th-12th grade LPS students to take free CE college courses during the summer.

First Generation

Students who are the first ones in their family to enroll in postsecondary education.

Success Rate

Fulfillment of a course of study by completing the course with a passing grade (A, B, or C).

ACTS

Our CTE/CE programming that collaborates with neighboring school districts to offer programs such as: Automotive, Cosmetology, Fire Science, EMT, etc.

Unduplicated

Each pupil is counted only once even if the pupil has taken more than one CE course.
