As you recall, our enrollment is projected to decrease slightly for the 2020-2021 school year. I have created a staffing plan that I will communicate to you in my May newsletter. This is an important process and I feel confident that this staffing plan will best meet the needs of our students.

In the spirit of planning for next year, we want to make sure that we do everything we can to ensure that our students are placed in a class where they will thrive and grow. The creation of classes is a collaborative effort between classroom teachers, specialists, and administration. There are many important factors we consider when creating classes. These include learning style, behavioral considerations, classroom environment, ability levels and stages of developmental readiness, social relationships, gender distribution, and participation in special programs. We have very talented, committed, and caring teachers who are committed to quality programming in every classroom. Therefore, we do not take specific requests for teachers. If you feel your child has a specific need or learning style that we should consider when deciding upon placement, we ask that you fill out the [Student Placement Input Form 2020](#) by Friday, April 24th. This placement input is completely optional and is not necessary for us to create balanced classrooms for the upcoming school year.


