- Immunization update LPS is expecting 100% immunization by 11/1 (either immunized or a signed waiver)
- Prop. CC Funds will not go to programming since it's not a fixed amount as it's tied to the economy. It's a "small band aid."
- Board is beginning to look at the climate survey and is looking at ways to continue having an "open-door" policy about culture and issues. They're looking at holding some town halls or a "thought exchange" platform that's done online
- 2021 operating budget will have \$4million in cuts. This will not come out of student support or teachers but at the administrative level.
