LONG-RANGE PLANNING COMMITTEE: CHARGE FOR CURRENT WORK

To review current elementary school boundaries east of Broadway and consider possible options to alleviate overcrowding at Dr. Justina Ford Elementary School.

COMMITTEE VALUES

Create schools of optimal size: 3 or 4 classes at every grade level (rounds), considering facility capacity, programming, with and without out-of-district enrollment.

Transportation efficiencies: avoid, wherever possible, crossing major north/south arterial roads and busing students past one school to attend another.

Keep neighborhoods together when possible.

Consider current feeder patterns.

Socioeconomic balance.

SPECIALIZED PROGRAMS

The district has a variety of specialized center-based programs designed to provide more intensive support to students who need it. Students who qualify for these programs are placed at the school through the IEP process. In those cases, the placement school becomes the home school, regardless of where in the district they live. This is different from open enrollment because these specialized supports are not available at every neighborhood school.

Gaskill Elementary houses the specialized program for deaf/hard-of-hearing students.

Ford Elementary houses the specialized program for students with Autism Spectrum Disorder.
