- How to Sign up to visit with your Counselor: Students can book an appointment to meet with their counselor by going to the <u>Counseling page</u> on the Heritage Website or by clicking on the blue "clipboard" at the bottom of the HHS Homepage. Make sure you sign up during an off hour, or email your counselor to set up an online Google meeting. During the first week of school counselors may not be able to answer their phones or check their email while working through the Schedule Correction requests. Please leave a message by phone or send an email to your counselor with the purpose of your contact so that the information you are seeking can be researched. Return communication will be made as soon as possible. If you need immediate attention, please call 303-347-7610 to speak with Becky Moody, Counseling Secretary, or 303-347-7613 to speak with Teresa Bailey, Registrar.
- Schedule Corrections: All students should have 6 classes in their schedule each quarter. Please make corrections for Quarter 1 and 2 prior to the August 26th deadline. Requests for schedule corrections can only be made for specific reasons and only if class size allows it. Note: All students have a lunch period. It is embedded in their 3rd and 4th hour classes. These are the only reasons a change would be considered:
 - Senior needs class for graduation requirements
 - Student has been placed in wrong level of class
 - Student fails to meet prerequisite of the class
 - Student is scheduled into more than six classes in a quarter
 - Student has been scheduled into two classes during the same period
 - Student has less than the six class minimum

Please note: Students are limited to one change request so please think this through carefully before submitting a schedule correction request. Counselors will contact you if they have any questions. Continue to attend the classes on your schedule until you see the change appear in Infinite Campus. Counselors are working hard to make sure all students have the classes they need. <u>SCHEDULE CORRECTION FORM</u>

• Credit Overload Request: Students are limited to 6 classes. Attempting to take 7 or 8 classes will be an extremely high, and in many cases, unmanageable workload. Because of this different schedule, students who would like to pursue taking 7 or 8 classes will need to fill out this request form, and counselors will work with families to discuss the benefits and potential challenges to this high academic workload. The emotional well-being and mental health of our students is more important than ever, so we encourage families to have serious conversations surrounding taking on this type of academic rigor before making a request. Decisions about any student's access to take additional classes will ultimately be made by the HHS Administration based on safety and health protocols, student's individualized needs, class size and course availability. <u>CREDIT OVERLOAD REQUEST</u>

SCHOOL PHOTOS/STUDENT IDS: ID photos for all students will be taken during English classes the week of August 22nd. Photographers will be in the Aux. Gym from 8:30 am to 3:30 pm each day. Any students who miss their English classes on their assigned day should check in with Lynn James in the Main Office. **Please note:** A student ID is required for all school activities and to check out library materials. Students who are interested in having an activity pass are encouraged to pay for the pass ahead of time - before their ID is printed. CHROMEBOOK CHECKOUT: All new 10th -12th graders will receive their Chromebooks during Orientation on Monday, August 15th. Returning 10th-12th graders will receive their Chromebooks during Advisory on August 22nd. All incoming freshmen will receive their Chromebooks during pictures on August 22nd-23rd. If your student is absent during their assigned checkout time, please contact the Main Office. **PARKING PERMITS:** We will begin collecting the 2022-2023 parking forms beginning Wednesday, August 17th. A table will be set up in the Main Entry from 10:30am-12:30pm. Students may stop by the table during those times from August 17th-August 19th. Beginning August 22nd, students may come to the Activities desk in the Main Office. Parking permits will be issued on a first come, first served basis. Please find the forms on the HHS Website under <u>School Forms</u>. To receive your parking pass for the 22-23 school year, you must bring copies of the following forms:

- In addition to the parking permit fee of \$50, all past due fees must be paid.

ANNUAL FAMILY CHECK-IN REMINDER: If you have not already completed the check-in, please <u>click this link</u> to view important **2022-2023 Annual Family Check-In Information** on the Summer Information page of the Heritage website. All students must have their primary parent/guardian complete the Check-In process before school begins. Please note: there are three steps to the HHS Annual Family Check-In:

- Step 1: Log on to your Parent Portal account on Infinite Campus. Click on the Annual Family Check-In link on the left menu bar, and click on the 2022-23 registry.
- Step 2: Return to the <u>Heritage website</u> and complete fee payment. Seniors are required to pay the \$25 graduation fee. All other fees are optional. Course fees will be added to student accounts in September.
- Step 3: Also on the <u>Heritage website</u> please take a few minutes to submit the PTO Volunteer Form the final step of the Check-In Process. If you sign up now, they will contact you when help is needed.

Dear Parents, Guardians, & Students of Heritage High School,

We hope you had a fantastic summer and are excited for the start of the 2022 – 2023 school year. As you start to plan for a new class schedule, and new routines, the City of Littleton would like you to consider a new way to get to and from school. For the past several years we have had serious concerns about the pick-up and drop-off that occurs along Windermere Street on the westside of the Heritage High School Campus. Vehicles often stop illegally on Windermere Street blocking bike lanes, blocking traffic lanes, damaging private property, and creating a chaotic environment where students crossing the street are more likely to be struck. Starting this school year, Littleton Public Schools has decided to relocate the school bus pick-up and drop-off location to the parking bays on Windermere Street. To support this change, the City of Littleton will be restricting vehicular parking to school buses only during the school day. Parking, stopping, or standing along Windermere Street (from Front Range Road to Hinsdale Court) will continue to be prohibited, with monitoring and enforcement by Littleton Police officers.

We understand that accessing the Heritage High School parking lots can be time consuming, but given the issues created by picking up and dropping off on Windermere Street (especially student safety), we are asking parents and guardians to plan accordingly and use the designated drop-off and pick-up areas within the Heritage Campus. Alternatively, parents, guardians, and students may consider exploring an alternative mode for getting to and from school. Later this year, the City of Littleton, Littleton Public Schools, and the Denver Regional Council of Governments (DRCOG) will launch a school specific online application to make it easier to set up a carpool group, a walking group, or biking group using DRCOG's SchoolPool program (https://waytogo.org/forcommuters/schoolpool). The SchoolPool program offers a secure way to connect with other families from Heritage High School and coordinate getting students to and from school. Sharing carpooling responsibilities, or setting up walking or biking groups, will reduce the number of vehicles and may even add some time back into the weeks of parents and guardians. The City of Littleton has also been working on a project to identify designated school routes more clearly to those using the roadway. These school routes can be viewed online at (https://citizen-problem-reporter-littleton.hub.arcgis.com/) and you will notice in the coming months that additional signage will be installed to help students navigate to school via walking or biking, as well as signs that alert drivers when they are driving on a school route. In the years to come, the City of Littleton will also be pursuing additional grant funding to upgrade the sidewalks and bike facilities along school routes throughout the City.

We know that change is never easy, but as the school year kicks off and you are introducing new weekday routines, we ask that you also make this small change to help address the aforementioned issues and improve student safety. Thank you in advance for your patience and attention to this matter. We hope everyone has a safe and productive school year!
