

Littleton Public Schools Concurrent Enrollment HB 1005 – Notification Notice

Littleton Public Schools would like to share with you the Concurrent Enrollment and other postsecondary course opportunities that are available to students through our high schools.

The Concurrent Enrollment (CE) program allow qualified high school students in grades 11-12 to enroll in college courses and earn credit, generally at low or no cost to them for tuition (exceptions may exist). The College Opportunity Fund and Littleton Public Schools will pay the tuition portion for two CE college courses at the local community college rates on behalf of the student. Qualified students can enroll in college academic, career and technical education courses, which may include course work related to apprenticeship programs and internship programs. CE programs may help students significantly reduce college expenses, increase the likelihood of completing college, and develop knowledge, marketable skills and abilities necessary to be ready for college and the workforce.

The process to enroll in these types of courses at the college is attached – *Student Steps to Concurrent Enrollment*.

Please see your high school counselor regarding the Concurrent Enrollment courses offered at your high school and the process to enroll.

Many classes apply toward a college degree or certificate. Students should also consider Guaranteed Transfer classes. Students must check with their high school counselor and consult the catalog for pre-requisite information.

Please check with your high school counselor, the LPS Concurrent Enrollment coordinator or the ACC Concurrent Enrollment Office to be sure that any college courses that you are or will be taking meet the CE requirements. This determination may affect the course cost, your ability to transfer course credits to another college, or the amount and/or type of credits that you might receive.

Littleton Public Schools will pay the tuition for up to two classes per semester minus COF (College Opportunity Fund) at an approved, public college *upon satisfactory completion of a "C" or better*.

Payment will be for tuition only at the in-state (resident) community college tuition rate. A student choosing to take a course at another institution must pay the difference in tuition. Fees and books are not covered by the district. Student proof of attendance in college classes' form must be completed by the student during the state required student count period. Students may participate in more than two courses with the cost the responsibility of the student.

Summer classes are not permitted.

If the student drops a college course after the drop deadline or does not pass the class(s) with a **"C' or better**, it shall be the student, or the student's parent or guardian's responsibility to pay Littleton Public Schools for the cost of tuition minus COF. The student must follow the colleges add/drop procedures and drop by the deadline established by the college.

Please meet with your high school counselor to make sure that any college courses that you are or will be taking meet the Concurrent Enrollment requirements. This determination may impact the course cost, your ability to transfer course credits to another college, or the amount and/or type of credits that you might receive.
