ALIGNING STUDENT PASSIONS WITH BUSINESS PIPELINES

Work-Based Learning (WBL) provides opportunities that occur in part or in whole in the workplace and gives the learner hands-on, real-world experience.

MENTOR

Mentoring is a professional relationship in which an experienced person (the Mentor) assists another (the Mentee) in developing specific skills and knowledge that will enhance the person's professional and personal growth in a specified area of interest.

JOB SHADOW

Job shadowing allows a student to spend a few hours or a day with a professional working in the student's career interest. The student has the opportunity to experience what the job is like and can ask questions too!

PRE-APPRENTICESHIP / APPRENTICESHIP

Pre-apprenticeship / apprenticeship programs work to ensure that students new to an industry or needing to gain critical academic skills receive the combination of industry-based training and classroom instruction needed to move along a pathway into an apprenticeship program.

PROJECT BASED LEARNING

Students work on a project over an extended period of time - from a week up to a semester - that engages them in solving a real-world problem or answering a complex question. They demonstrate their knowledge and skills by developing a public product or presentation for a real audience.

INTERNSHIP

Internships offer a student the opportunity to work in an organization, sometimes without pay, to gain work experience to satisfy requirements for a qualification and / or to explore an area of work related interest.

ON-THE-JOB TRAINING

On-the-Job Training occurs at the workplace while doing the actual job. Usually a professional trainer or experienced employee serves as the course instructor using hands-on training often supported by classroom work.

INDUSTRY SPEAKERS

Industry speakers educate and inspire an audience of students about their specific field providing details relevant to student's interests relating to career awareness.

SITE-BASED TOURS

Site-based tours are guided tours of a business premises offering more detailed information on office surroundings, type of work, and general everyday activity. This is an opportunity to inspire the next generation of workers and give them vital insight into what is required to succeed in a specific business or industry. It could also include activities, workshops, classes and a chance for students to interact with employees.

PANEL PRESENTATIONS

Panel presentations offer a wide range of perspectives on a given topic and offer support and reasons for those positions from a group of experts.

ADVISORY COMMITTEES

Advisory committees are made up of individuals with experience and expertise in the occupational field(s) that the program serves. They advise educators on the design, development, implementation, evaluation, maintenance, and revision of Career and Technical Education (CTE) programs within a career pathway.
