




Elena Vanishing by Elena Dunkle



In an honest memoir, Jason Kovacs tells the story of growing up with an abusive father, who contracted HIV and ultimately died of AIDS when Jason was a teenager.




Point of Vanishing: A Memoir of Two Years in Solitude by Howard Axelrod








Kinesthetic Classroom: Teaching and Learning Through Movement






Russian Poets (Everyman's Library Pocket Poets) edited by Peter Washington








I Crawl Through It by A. S. King

Last Bus to Wisdom by Ivan Doig



This time, though, Donal has a companion, Kate's browbeaten, glass-eyed, sort-of husband, Herman the German. Published posthumously.






You and Me and Him by Kris Dinnison

Queen of Shadows by Sarah Maas





FIC REVIS



Snakeroot by Andrea Cremer




