CAS news

Juniors: propose Integrated CAS Projects

All IB juniors turned in their CAS Integrated Project Proposals at the beginning of December. Mrs. Clapsaddle will approve the proposals within the next week and then students can begin logging them in ManageBac. So far we have some interesting ideas including creating a dance boot camp for kids, leading educational nature walks, making a LHS IB promotional video, and working to get the symbol for invisible disabilities added to Colorado ID's. *All projects must be completed before the first day of senior year.*

Seniors: log all CAS experiences by January 1

Before January 1, *all CAS experiences* must be logged and approved on ManageBac. Remember that the CAS completion deadline -- with all pieces of the program, including reflections and supervisor reviews -- is March 1, 2019.

What's happening in the classroom?

Students in Lisa Sutterer's IB European History class have been turning in 3 x 5 cards reflecting on the Learner Profile traits all semester. Her student assistants, Abby Lister and Ashlyn Moore, were tasked with compiling them and were so inspired by these writings that they wanted to throw the IB students an awards ceremony. YAY - the extended essay is finished!

IB seniors completed their extended essays right before Thanksgiving break. They will meet one last time with their adviser and finish their final reflection on the extended essay research and writing process. Students wrote on a variety of topics. Here are a few of their research questions.

- Sam Glaser: Global Politics essay "To what extent has the opioid epidemic affected pregnant mothers and newborns, and how should these effects shape public policy makers' response to the crisis in the United States and Colorado?"
- Christian Sapakoff: Psychology essay "How effective are running and walking as a treatment for depression as opposed to antidepressants or psychotherapy?"
- Carien Hoogwater: Mathematics essay "To what extent are derivatives elegant?"

Field Trip to the Mizel Museum: IB junior and senior history classes travelled to the Mizel Museum in Denver for a field trip with their teachers James Gordon and Lisa Sutterer. A holocaust survivor Sara Moses shared her experience at the Piotrków ghetto and later the Bergen Belsin camp, both in Poland, and discussed her reunion with her father after the liberation of the camps. We also watched a film about Hannah Szenes and a small group of other Jewish men and women from Palestine who parachuted into Hungary to help in the liberation effort. The afternoon entailed a tour of the museum where students could look at artifacts, symbols, art pieces, and photographs representing the complex and rich journey of the Jewish people throughout centuries.
